


2020 Changing Exhibits

Sacred Reflections: The Art of Umatilla Artist Ellen Taylor April 9 - June 6

Contemporary Native American artist Ellen Taylor—a member of Cayuse-Umatilla-Walla Walla Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation near Pendleton, Oregon—has been painting since she was in grade school. She has said that her art "comes from visions, feelings, life experiences, death, turmoil, new birth, illness, relationships and the history of life." Ellen is known for the innovative way that her ideas are realized on canvas with each piece coming from a different place in her heart yet woven together in perfect harmony. Ellen's art has been described as "Picasso meets Native American type of contemporary art in Andy Warhol's living room type of thing." Ellen says, "The perfect balance comes from finding the time to create, articulate and harmonize these ideas onto canvas, in an otherwise busy life. Her innovation is phenomenal and the way her ideas hit the canvas like no other.

"Into The Fray: Native American Wild-Land Firefighters of Warm Springs and Beyond" June 25 - September 26

Native Americans across Indian Country align to the basic elements of the earth. Weather, the stars, water, and fire are essential elements of change in the lives of Native Americans. Fire purifies. Tribes used it in the hunt, for cooking and cleaning land. It was a tool with significant impact in Indian Country throughout ancient times. This exhibit will examine the lives of our Native Brothers and Sister firefighters of Warm Springs and beyond. From training, operations, the grueling hours of intense physical exertion, they form bonds, share the rewards and tell stories of their elite corps. They are part of our contemporary culture and contribute to our land's story and the safeguarding and preservation of our land for future generations.
