Our culture, tribal and family history, dance, art, ceremonies, music, and traditional practices are the foundation of our identity—for each tribe and each tribal member. The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Cultural Trust Committee chose this name because it communicates the highest purpose of their effort.

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**Washanaksha Grant Guidelines**

**The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Washanaksha Board is seeking grant applications from The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Tribal Members, Residents of the Warm Springs Reservation, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Programs & Committees, and Warm Springs Community Organizations. Grant funding is sponsored by the Oregon Cultural Trust which provides funding to Oregon County groups and Tribes to support the arts and heritage. The fiscal sponsor is The Museum At Warm Springs. The Washanaksha Board must support projects and activities that address one of the following four priorities outlined within the Warm Springs Washanaksha Cultural Plan:**

1. Promote Tribal Member and Residents' understanding of and involvement in cultural activities, traditions, arts, language, dance, history, music, etc.
2. Pass on Tribal knowledge and practices to our youth and help them feel connected to their culture.
3. Preserve, Practice, and Teach our Tribal Languages: Ichishkiin, Numu, and Kiksht.
4. Support the work of our artists and traditional teachers, including their ability to earn a living from their work.

**Grant Awards:**

The maximum grant award is \$1,200. The Washanaksha Board wants to make awards to as many applicants as possible.

**Eligibility:**

Applications will be accepted from The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Tribal Members, Residents of the Warm Springs Reservation, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Programs & Committees, and Warm Springs Community Organizations. Grants to Tribal Members will be considered first. Any remaining funding will be awarded to applicants from the other three eligible groups. Prior grant recipients must have submitted all reports required by the Washanaksha Board grant agreements before applying for this years grant. **Projects Must Be Completed In 6 Months.**

**Completion Of Project Must Occur By July 31, 2017.**
