Application for Scholarship Award

Purpose of Award:

To assist Indian students pursuing a course of study leading toward an undergraduate or graduate degree in natural resources, fisheries, wildlife management, resource recreation, conservation law enforcement, or environmental sciences.

Maximum Award:

This will be Two (2) awards of \$1,000 (scholarships) presented by the Native American Fish & Wildlife Society's Pacific Region which can be used for any aspect of undergraduate, technical, or graduate education, including tuition, textbooks, equipment, travel, and living expenses. Minimum award:

Eligible Applicant:

- A. Must be a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe. (copy of your enrollment card)*
- B. Must be a full time student at an accredited institution of higher education in a natural resource or related field.
- C. Applicant must have completed <u>one academic year</u> of study at an accredited institution of higher education in a natural resource or related field.
- D. Applicants must have an overall 2.00 G.P.A.

Application:

- A. Proof of enrollment in an accredited institution of higher education.
- B. Submit appropriate high school, undergraduate, or graduate transcripts.
- C. Three letter of recommendation (1. tribal representative; 2. Teacher, counselor, etc.: and 3. Community member).
- D. Educational and career commitment essay 500 words or less.
- E. Evidence of scholastic and service awards, if available.
- F. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Evaluation of Applicant (Total points awarded = 100)

Review of applicant's grades, transcripts, and essay (70 points)

Documentation of any leadership positions held by applicants while in school and three letters of assessment that address the applicant's potential for success and leadership in his/her field. (30 points).
