**August 22-26, 2021**

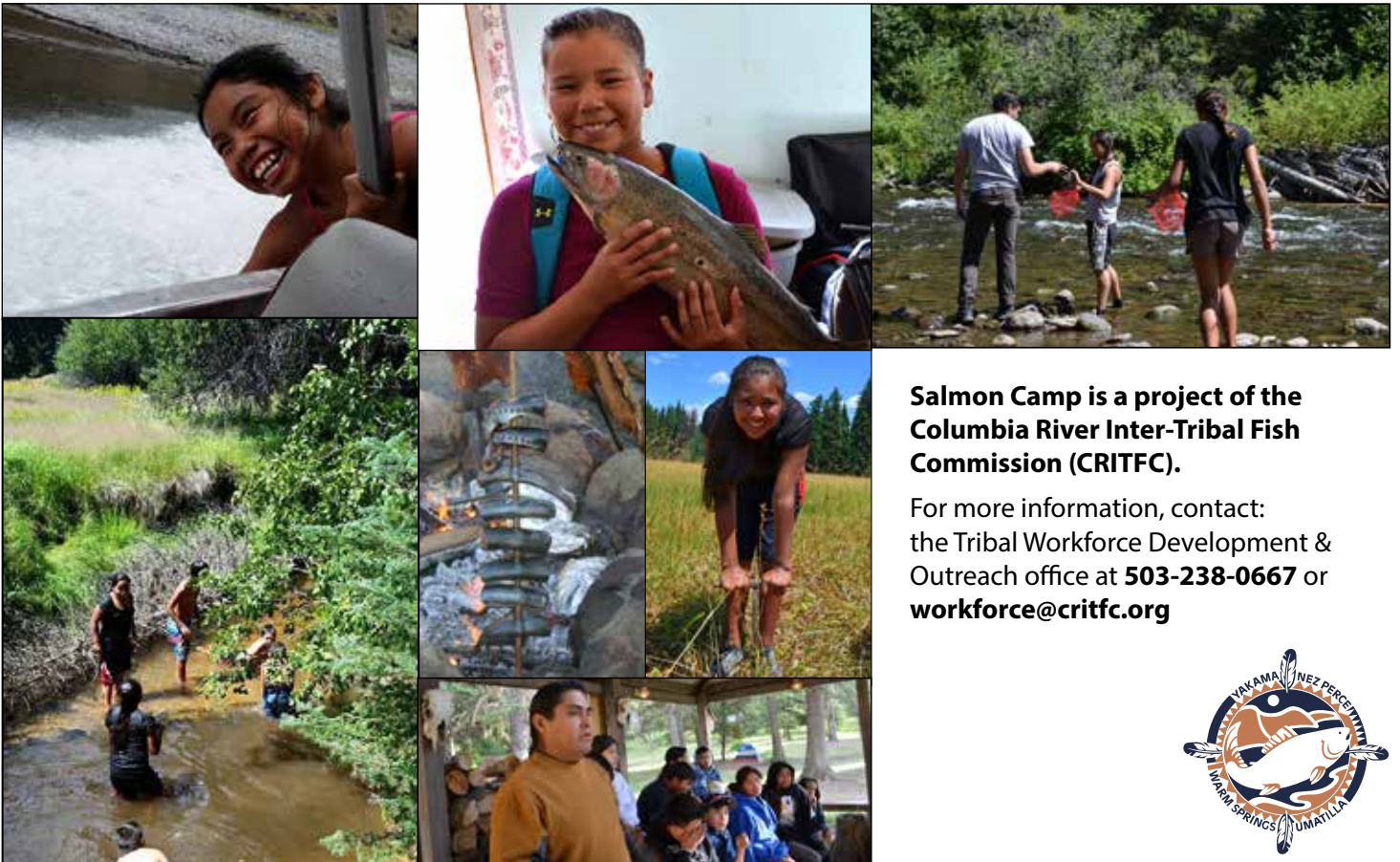
hosted by the Warm Springs Tribe at Camp Namanu

Salmon Camp is **free** but space is **limited**. Participants are selected through an application process. Applications must be received by **June 17, 2022**. All meals and lodging are included. A stipend will be provided upon successful program completion.
